Tate Modern and Tate Britain

Tate Gallery is a network of four galleries in the UK: Tate Britain, Tate Liverpool, Tate St Ives and Tate Modern. Entry to the gallery is free – there's no need to book. Tate Modern has over a hundred years of art, from modernism in the early 1900s, to exciting works created today. Tate Britain's collection is focused on art made in Britain.

#### Sky Garden

One of the most beautiful viewpoints over the whole of London is on the 35th floor, just 150 metres above street level, the Sky Garden. Entry to the "walkie-talkie" building is free, but must be booked in advance. The 360-degree view takes place on the last three floors of the skyscraper, both indoors and outdoors.

# Roval Greenwich Observatory

The Greenwich Meridian Line, the prime meridian, is the centre of world time defined by a passage instrument and a survey baseline in the courtyard of the Royal Observatory. Every day at 1pm you can watch the "ball drop" on the dome. A panel on the façade still points out the zero longitude ... a very popular photo spot.


## St. Paul's Cathedrale

At the end of the 17th century it was the tallest building in the city, now it is a prominent landmark in London's cityscape. The church, which is cruciform in plan, is the resting place of numerous recognised and royal figures. Visits to the masses and the interior are possible daily between 10 am and 6 pm. Those wishing to visit the crypt and observation platforms must book tours and tickets for a fee. I recommend arriving before noon to enjoy free aisles and panoramic views.
